








On a sunny Autumn day a very special girl visited Westminster Cathedral.

She had travelled all the way from Syria, seeing many places along the way. She was in search of her mother and an education.









She had walked through Turkey, Greece, Switzerland, France, Germany and Belgium before coming to the United Kingdom.
